President Carroll, running for re-election is debating opponents Speaker of the House Lancing and General Waters. After the recent scandals, the moderator is expected to ask detailed questions about the candidates' stances on the Resonance Project. This is an open format debate, and questions may come from the press on the floor as well.

You have been appointed by the Commission on Presidential Debates as moderator for this debate. It is a great honor. Your job is to ask thought-provoking questions, time responses, and intervene in the case of misbehavior on the part of any candidate. 3. Many people in the USA think that we spend too much on defense. Would you cut defense funding, and, if so, where?

However, something is wrong. All these people are making your head hurt. You've always been an extrovert and good at reading people, but now it seems almost like everyone's emotions are screaming in your head. Every time someone gets upset or excited it hurts so badly. You just want to run and hide. But you have to do your job, even if you can barely stand from the pain.
